

# Walk Into History

## LAKES REGION

### 1. Indian Mortar Lot

This glacial border in Franklin contains a hollowed out section used by the Abnaki Indians and first settlers for grinding corn and maize.

### 2. Belknap Mill

This mill is the oldest unaltered brick textile mill in the United States. It contains a bell cast by George Holbrook, apprentice to Paul Revere.

### 3. George Hoyt Whipple

Dr. Whipple shared the Nobel Prize for Medicine after discovering a treatment for a blood disorder.

### 4. Effingham Union Academy Building

This building was the site of the first school dedicated to the instruction and training of teachers. It is sometimes called The First Normal School.

### 5. Chinook Kennels

These kennels produced Alaskan Malamute and Siberian Husky dogs that were used on the Byrd Antarctic Expeditions and the Army's Search and Rescue units.

### 6. The Chocorua Legend

Mt. Chocorua is named after a Pequawket Chieftain who was slain on the peak of the mountain.
